





#### Recovery & Resilience Funding Sources

#### 404 – HMGP: Hazard Mitigation Grant Program

- Provide protection, reduction, and/or elimination of future risk to lives and property from natural hazards
- Disaster damaged and non-damaged facilities


#### 406 – PA: Public Assistance Program

- Provide mitigation measures in conjunction with the repair of the disaster-damaged facilities.
- Damaged facilities only

#### 428 – PAAP: Public Assistance Alternative Procedures

- Single "lump-sum" provided for hazard mitigation projects. It is intended to reduce costs and provide disaster recovery funds sooner, based on estimates for total project costs.
- Disaster damaged and non-damaged facilities








Phase 1: Downtown







